


## NEW BOOKS



In this book, Tanguy Struye tackles the relationship between the United States and China. He deals with this bilateral relationship through a theoretical approach of the concept of "power", while illustrating his approach with several practical examples. Going against most of the current studies which predict China's political emergence, this book considers the following scenario as its thesis: What if Washington continued to dominate and rule over the international scene?



In this book, Barthélémy Courmont analyses the North Korean case, by means of focusing on North Korea's functioning and ideology, but also on the relations between Pyongyang and the other great powers of the international scene.



Resulting from a symposium on the concept of "power" and held on April 29, 2015, in Louvain-La-Neuve, the publication of this book –edited by Professor Tanguy Struye and Dorothee Vandamme– addresses the issue of power in this early 21st century. It does so through theoretical chapters accompanied by practical study cases.
